What you will need:

- Empty milk bottles
- Glow sticks
- Permanent marker

What to do:

- Clean out the milk bottle
- Draw on a spooky face with permanent marker
- Add a glow stick
- Turn off the lights!

Why not make a family of spooky ghosts?

The science bit?

The plastic tube of the glow stick holds a solution of an oxalate ester and an electron-rich dye along with a glass vial filled with a hydrogen peroxide solution. The 'snap' that starts the reaction is you breaking the glass tube, releasing the hydrogen peroxide.
