Across this term, senior leaders have worked closely with our Pupil Leadership Team and the whole school to find ways to offer an enhanced dinner experience for all children as this is such an important time to enable the children to learn and embed social skills.

Mrs Paul and Mrs Deeley, held a whole school assembly in Autumn 1 to discuss the experience and the improvements the children would like. Many good suggestions were given and an agreed understanding that it was a collective responsibility to enhance the experience by having shared high expectations by the children. These expectations are displayed daily in the hall alongside a new 'Thunk' question each day to spark conversation whilst the children have their dinner - thank you to Mrs Lemm for updating this.

A 'Name the Dinner Hall' competition was launched, with the Pupil Leadership Team sitting on the judging panel (well done Heath for winning this competition). Mr Day was tasked to use the winning name to create a range of logo designs, which were presented to the Pupil Leadership Team. Following the selection of the design, bespoke lunchtime aprons were created for Year 6 helpers, thank you to Miss Bolt. Additional resources such as long stick dustpan and brushes, ipad holders so that staff can reward positive praise via Trackit Lights were purchased. Mr Day was then tasked to create table signs for each class so the area can be reserved. The launch of the VIP Priority Table took place this Monday with children

receiving the Role Model Award in praise being selected to have their lunch with senior leaders on a special table - thank you to Mrs Khan for sourcing the resources and Mrs Townsend for supporting. The selected children were given special lanyards in the Monday Morning assembly to wear - thank you to Miss Harrington and Mr Day for the creation of these.

The project will be led by the Hippodrome's artists with expert guidance in accessibility from Turtle Key Arts.


This offer is open to everyone on the autism spectrum, including those who are undiagnosed or awaiting diagnosis.

What have our year groups been focusing on this week and what the focus after half term....?



#### Year 1

This week, we have started reading the story: The Polar Express by Chris Van Allsburg. We have been looking for nouns and adjectives within the story.

#### Year 5


This week, we were invited to watch children at Brownhills Ormiston Academy perform Matilda. It was an amazing performance - the children thoroughly enjoyed it!
