





Primary Careers 2030 Subscription for 2021/22

Raise aspirations; broaden horizons; increase cultural capital and improve social mobility.

Pupils will engage with a range of employers from your chosen sectors to discuss the world of work, identifying what careers in their sector in 2030 might look like. The aim of each event is to allow pupils to -

Gain an understanding of current careers in each sector.

Look back 10 years to what careers existed and how they have changed and compare with what Careers in 2030 might look like in each sector.

Challenge stereotypical thinking and endorse inspirational messages delivered by employers, as role models for

Increase pupils' understanding of the link between education, qualifications and career opportunities.

Expose pupils to sectors unknown to them or their families and sectors they would not ordinarily consider. Engage parents / carers in this process and aim to challenge their attitudes, perceptions and aspirations relating to their child's education and career choices at primary age, by setting a series of home learning tasks.

Encourage pupils to focus on the 8 essential skills for the world of work, to understand their relevance and application in school and learn how and when to apply them in context.

Package 1 - Apprenticeship

- Unlimited access to all curriculum materials, plus one event per term delivered via MS Teams 3 events per year. Schools select from a menu of 10 sector events or a stereotype event.
 Events will be delivered on set dates throughout the year (see calendar).

 - A calendar of events will be issued at the beginning of each new academic year.
 Comprehensive teacher guidance notes will be provided.
 If a school is unable to attend a specific sector event remotely, they will receive a recorded copy of the live event

COST - £750 per year

Package 2 - Fast track

• As Apprenticeship, including one live event per half term, delivered via Teams - 6 events per year.

COST - £1000 per year

Package 3 - Graduate

• As Apprenticeship, including 9 live events per year, delivered via MS Teams - including the stereotypes event.

COST - £1500 per year

Package 4 – Masters (bespoke package available for 2021/22)

As Apprenticeship, including access to 11 live events per year, and a half-day bespoke support for senior leaders for curriculum implementation and action planning.
