

Dear Parents,

Welcome to Remote Learning in Nursery!

As a Nursery team, we want to take this opportunity to reassure you that we are going to make the best of the situation and will be supporting the learners of Nursery, and their families to continue learning at home. We will provide opportunities to review learning already covered, as well as continuing with the Nursery curriculum. We are curious, independent and resourceful and a change of classroom location is not going to stop us from learning!

An outline of a typical day in Nursery

A typical day in Nursery starts with a Phonics lesson. We would normally spend around 10-15 minutes on our Phonics learning - this is where the children have the opportunity to tune into sounds, learn new sounds and practise reading sounds and simple words such as c-a-t=cat.

Following this, next we do '5 Minute Maths'. This is where the children have the opportunity to sing the days of the week, the months of the year, focus on the date and look at repeated patterns. We would also introduce opportunities for children to think critically, count and order numbers to 10.

We focus on a 'story book or topic' each week and immerse the children in the topic through an awe and wonder and give them regular opportunities to revisit and re-tell the story.

We spend an hour of our Nursery session, focusing on child-initiated learning. During this time, we focus on the other five areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage. These five areas are, Personal, Social, Emotional Development, Communication and Language, Physical Development, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. We will be using SEESAW to set daily learning around these five areas. Each area will be covered throughout the week.

After this, we would have a 'snack time and time to talk session'. During this session, we talk about a range of things including: interesting pictures, to the snack we are eating, focusing on our senses. Talking and spending time with your child is, as you know, an important and precious time as they grow up so quickly!

We also read additional stories and sing rhymes together.



Whilst we realise it will be challenging for you to replicate the entire structure of our school day, you may wish to mirror some of the features in order to provide some continuity.
